1. Who We Are

East Jordan Plastics, Inc.

Financial Reporting Year: January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023.

East Jordan Plastics satisfies the definition of an entity under the Act by doing business in Canada, having over \$20m in assets and sales over \$40m in 2023.

East Jordan Plastics is a manufacturer that sells plastic horticultural containers to growers (flowers, vegetables, etc.) throughout the United States and Canada.

The major components in our manufacturing process are recycled and virgin plastic flakes and pellets and colorant pellets from recycling and manufacturing operations in North America.

2. Entity's Structure, Activities, and Supply Chains

a. Structure.

East Jordan Plastics is an S-Corporation (US EIN 38-1859760). The business number is 89914 0800 RT0001.

The Company is controlled by a Board of Directors.

East Jordan Plastics has 379 employees in the United States of American and 1 employee in Canada.

b. Activities

East Jordan Plastics is a manufacturer that sells plastic horticultural containers to growers (flowers, vegetables, etc.) throughout the United States and Canada. Approximately 4.4 million pounds of plastic horticultural containers were shipped into Canada in calendar year 2023.

This privately held business has been family owned and operated for more than three generations. Throughout the years, the family has grown EJP through hard work, superior customer service, quality products with competitive pricing, and a loyal customer base.

There are no known or reported instances of forced labor or child labor in our workforce. All employees are over the age of 18 years old and meet the requirements of all local employment laws.

Our Company manufactures and sells plastic horticultural containers to growers (flowers, vegetables, etc.) throughout the United States and Canada. Plastics have not been identified as



having an inherent risk of forced or child labor according to the 2022 List of Goods Produced by Child Labor or Forced Labor, which is put out by the United Stated Department of Labor.

Based on the research performed in order to produce this report, none of the goods and services directly purchased by East Jordan Plastics have been identified as having inherent risks of forced or child labor.

As a result of not having any known instances of forced or child labor within East Jordan Plastics' operations, no steps or actions are required to remediate or address such forced or child labor related risks.

3. Entity's Policies and Due Diligence Processes in relation to forced labor and child labor.

East Jordan Plastics does not currently have any policies directly addressing forced labor or child labor. The Company does not hire employees under the age of 18. The Company has four (4) facilities in Michigan and one (1) facility in Georgia. East Jordan Plastics is an at-will employer, meaning either employer or employee may terminate the employment relationship at any time for any lawful reason.

All new employees are required to read and acknowledge all policies, including those related to workplace violence, harassment, and safety. East Jordan Plastics believes that every employee has the right to work in an environment free of unlawful discrimination and unwelcome verbal or physical conduct which harasses, disrupts, or interferes with the employee's work performance or creates an intimidating, offensive, or hostile environment. East Jordan Plastics prohibits any form of discrimination, harassment, joking remarks, stories, nicknames, or other abusive conduct directed at employees or others doing business with East Jordan Plastics because of their race (including traits historically associated with race, including but not limited to hair texture and protective hairstyles), color, religion, sex, gender, pregnancy, national origin, age, physical or mental disability, genetic information, height, weight, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, marital status, military status, or other protected status in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local laws. These important policies are updated periodically and re-shared with all employees.

Since East Jordan Plastics has not encountered any instances of forced labor or child labor, it does not currently have policies addressing the topic specifically, nor has the Company had trainings on the topic. East Jordan Plastics will evaluate whether it should implement policies or trainings on forced or child labor.

4. Parts of business and supply chains that carry a risk of forced labor or child labor being used and the steps taken to assess and manage that risk.

The Company is not aware of any risks related to forced or child labor at this time.

Our Company manufactures and sells plastic horticultural containers to growers (flowers, vegetables, etc.) throughout the United States and Canada. Plastics have not been identified as



having an inherent risk of forced or child labor according to the 2022 List of Goods Produced by Child Labor or Forced Labor, which is put out by the United Stated Department of Labor.

5. Any measures taken to remediate any forced labor or child labor.

East Jordan Plastics does not hire anyone under the age of 18 years old. The Company has not taken any remedial measures because no instances of forced or child labor have been identified within the Company or within its supply chain.

6. Any measures taken to remediate the loss of income to the most vulnerable families that results from any measure taken to eliminate the use of forced labor or child labor in its activities and supply chains.

Since East Jordan Plastics has not encountered any instances of forced labor or child labor, it does not currently have policies addressing the topic specifically, nor has the Company had trainings on the topic. East Jordan Plastics will evaluate whether it should implement policies or trainings on forced or child labor.

The Company does not hire individuals under the age of 18 and employees are made aware of this policy at onboarding. All employees are also made aware of the policies on Workplace Violence and Harassment.

8. How the entity assesses its effectiveness in ensuring that forced labor and child labor are not being used in its business and supply chains.

To date, East Jordan Plastics has not encountered any instances of forced labor or child labor. The Company regularly audits its policies and procedures described above. In 2024, East Jordan Plastics plans to take further actions to address any potential risks and ensure our suppliers are adhering to best practices.
