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Eusi Farms Ltd. has developed an action plan during the 2023 fiscal year to be implemented in the 2024 fiscal year. Action steps are outlined in the previous section of the report. Also, activities and supply chains were mapped out to identify where forced labour and/or child labour could be present.

5. Additional Information on entity's structure, activities, and supply chains
  - Entity's structure- Eusi Farms Ltd. is a privately held, incorporated organization under the Ontario Business Corporations Act.
  - Activities- Eusi Farms Ltd. is a farming business with activities focused on beef production and cash crops.
    1. Cattle- are sourced from Canada and the USA, fed on farm, and are sold to Canadian and American meat processors. Feed ingredients and medication are also brought in to support the production of cattle.
    2. Cash crops- include wheat, corn, and sugar beets. They are raised on farm, and either used on farm for the feeding of cattle, sold to the USA for sugar production, or sold to local grain elevators. Seed, fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides and fuel are used in the production of cash crops.
  - Supply chains-
    1. Cattle- calves are born and raised on smaller farms, then sent to background yards for a few months before being transferred to feedlots for finishing. Once the cattle are finished they are sent to an abattoir for further processing before being sent to other food facilities, eventually ending up as an end product of beef.
    2. Cash crops- Seeds are planted on farm, grow into plants, and then are harvested. From there, each cash crop goes a different direction. Sugar beets are sent to a sugar beet processing plant, where they eventually become sugar to the end user. Corn is fed on farm to Eusi Farms' cattle. Wheat is sold to local grain elevators where it will eventually be sold to an end user.
6. Does the entity currently have policies and due diligence processes in place related to forced labour and/or child labour?
  - No- to be introduced and implemented in 2024 fiscal year

  - No- the risks are to be assessed in 2024 fiscal year
8. Areas of entity's activities and supply chains that carry a risk of forced labour.


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- While Eusi Farms Ltd. has not completed its formal assessment of risks within its actives and supply chains during the 2023 fiscal year, historically, farming has been an industry that has contributed to forced labour and child labour.

    - Not applicable- the company has not identified any forced labour or child labour in its activities.

    - No, loss of income as a result of eliminating forced labour or child labour has not been identified.

    - No, training for employees making contracting or purchasing decisions will be implemented in 2024 fiscal year.

    - No formal process was in place for the 2023 fiscal year. A plan to develop an assessment is scheduled for 2024 fiscal year.
