

Green Line Hose & Fittings Ltd: Report on Actions Against Forced and Child Labour

Overview

Green Line Hose & Fittings Ltd and its subsidiaries (Green Line) are opposed to the use of forced labour and child labour in the production of any goods or services that we buy or sell. It is important to Green Line that forced labour, child labour, or any other form of modern slavery is not used to produce any of the goods purchased by Green Line. This report covers activities between June 1, 2023 to May 31, 2024.

This report is submitted as a joint report that includes Green Line Hose & Fittings Ltd as well as the following subsidiaries:

Pulsar Hydraulics Ltd, Green Line Manufacturing Ltd, Boyaux et Raccords Green Line Ltée.

In this report the collective companies above will be referred to as “Green Line”, “we”, “our”, or “us”.

Company Structure and Overview

Green Line is privately owned and is a supplier of industrial and hydraulic hose and fittings. We service a broad range of industries throughout Canada.

Supply Chain

Green Line searches out and qualifies manufacturers of our product lines from around the globe to provide top quality products at value prices to our extensive customer base. Potential suppliers are evaluated based on product quality, service, pricing, and (now also) potential risk for forced or child labour to ensure the best value for our customers.

Addressing Forced Labour

Green Line has developed a supplier qualification process aimed at reducing the probability that child or forced labour is an issue within our supply chain.

Green Line operations are all based in Canada and all employees fall under Canadian employment legislation. We consider there to be a very low risk of forced or child labour in our direct workforce.

The majority of our purchases originate from countries with similarly robust legislation regarding child and forced labour. We consider these areas to also carry a very low risk as well for exposure to child and forced labour.

Goods originating from countries where the risk of the use of child or forced labour is greater are viewed with a more critical eye. Our purchasing management has been familiarized with the

International Labour Organization – Combating Forced Labour, A handbook for Employers and Business.

We have also reviewed the U.S Department of Labor List of Goods Produced by Child or Forced Labor and found no direct dealings between the countries and goods listed and the trade engaged with Green Line.

Green Line has also reached out, polled, and received attestations from its vendor base that they evaluate, and take measures to limit the risk of child and/or forced labour in their supply chains.

The effectiveness of these measures has not been evaluated to date.

Remediation Measures

To date Green Line has not needed to enact any remediation measures in the past year.
