- its policies and its due diligence processes company prohibits the use of forced labour and child labour; representatives of the company make enquires of suppliers and recruitment of staff to validate no such labour is used
- the parts of its business and supply chains that carry a risk of forced labour suppliers use of child labour exist; as such, we inspect suppliers wherever possible and source from reputable vendors
- any measures taken to remediate non have been reported
- any measures taken to remediate the loss of income to the most vulnerable families non have been reported
- the training provided to employees on forced labour and child labour company has an employee handbook speaking to fair treatment of all team members;
- Company applies industry common approaches to assesses its effectiveness in ensuring that forced labour and child labour are not being used in its business and supply chains.


