Pacific Pilotage Authority (“PPA”)

Reporting period: January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023

The PPA is a federal Crown corporation, which is headquartered and operating in British Columbia, Canada. It provides marine pilotage services.

The PPA purchases goods from within Canada and, to a lesser extent, outside Canada to support its operations in providing marine pilotage services.
