1. Introduction

This report is made on behalf of Sherwood Chevrolet Inc. and describes the actions taken by the Company during the financial year ending December 31, 2023, to assess, prevent and reduce the risk that forced labour or child labour is used at any step in its operations and supply chains pursuant to the requirements of section 11 of the *Fighting Against Forced Labour and Child Labour in Supply Chains Act* ("Act"). 2. Structure, Activities and Supply Chains

Sherwood Chevrolet Inc. specializes in the retail and commercial / fleet sale of motor vehicles and parts as well as comprehensive vehicle servicing and repairs.

As a dealer of new and used vehicles and their parts, our supply chain is primarily based on the supply chain of automotive manufacturers. Specifically, as an authorized Chevrolet dealer, the majority of the Company's procurement spend is with General Motors (GM) Canada. We also purchase goods and services from other third-party suppliers. This would include related inventory from other OEM's when necessary, other parts distributors, and large office supplies providers.
