RTO Asset Management Inc. (operating as “**easyhome**”) is committed to supporting and respecting the protection of human rights and stands against all forms of modern slavery and human trafficking. We understand the important role we play in respecting human rights, and we aim to avoid causing or contributing to adverse human rights impacts.

This report is published under *Canada’s Fighting Against Forced Labour and Child Labour in Supply Chains Act* (“the **Act**”) on behalf of easyhome (“**we**”, “**us**” or “**our**”)

This report covers this entity’s fiscal year ended 2024.

1. OUR STRUCTURE, ACTIVITIES, AND SUPPLY CHAINS

Easyhome is part of goeasy Ltd. and is a lease-to-own company, offering household furniture, appliances and electronics to consumers under weekly or monthly leasing agreements through both corporate and franchise stores.

We do not produce goods. We are the ‘importer of record’ for goods produced by only one multi-national supplier – For context, this multi-national supplier operates in Canada, and per Public Safety Canada’s ‘Catalogue of Reports’ this multi-national supplier also submitted an Annual Report in 2024 pursuant to the Act. easyhome purchases goods from various suppliers, all of whom are subject to our rigorous vendor-screening processes.

2. OUR POLICIES

We conduct ongoing screening of all suppliers, which allows us to assess a supplier’s risk profile and subsequently flag and assess any activities that would violate our corporate values. We discuss any instances where corrective actions are required with the suppliers and track these issues to completion.

3. RISKS

We recognize that human rights observers have identified the potential for modern slavery and human trafficking in industries related to the production of goods such as electronics, office furniture, and in the production of materials that may be present in those goods, such as steel, timber, and textiles.

4. TRAINING

We provide our staff with training which aligns with our regulatory obligations in all of the jurisdictions in which we operate.

5. ASSESSING EFFECTIVENESS

We periodically review our supplier screening process and other compliance programs to ensure they remain current and aligned with business activities, regulatory developments, industry standards and best practices.



6. CONCLUSION

easyhome remains committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking from taking place in our businesses and in our supply chains. We will continue to review our policies, procedures and practices periodically to determine any enhancements we can make to help prevent modern slavery and human trafficking.
